Every class had lessons on how they can "Reach Our" to help other kids who might be feeling sad or lonely.


Mrs Mc Crum held special assemblies for each Key stage.














Fitness Freddy:

- Connect






Adobe Express Digital Leaders:

Recently some parents have endangered pupils by entering classrooms without express permission from the school office. Remember:

NO ONE CAN ENTER THE SCHOOL BUILDING ONCE THE DOOR IS SECURED AT 9:15AM

If P1 or P2 children arrive at school after 9:15am and the gate is locked, you go to reception, sign the late book and either the Principal or Secretary will take your child to class. You cannot escort your child to class. **SORRY!**

Pupils in other classes P3 — P7 who arrive after 9:15am must be signed in at Reception by the accompanying adult — no exceptions. Pupils should not go directly to Mobile Classrooms and press the Buzzer — they must be signed in.
