Pupils from ASC2 started swimming on Wednesday 4th October. We have subsidised transport for P7 pupils as part of a legacy agreement with the Education Authority. However, we could not access affordable transport for ASC2 pupils. Thanks to Lorcan Totten (dad of Caragh Rós) who approached Creagh Concrete for financial assistance to help meet the cost. Creagh Concrete have very generously supported our pupils by their donation of £4,719 to meet the costs for this academic year.

A Lecture by Dr Séamas Ó Donnghaile

School Census:



On the 6th October the annual DE school census took place. In St. Brigid's we had 246 pupils, 113 boys and 134 girls. 12 pupils had a Statement of Educational Needs. We have a total of 17 pupils in our two Autism specific Classes.

World Mental Health Day:

On Tuesday 10th October we marked World Mental Health Day with a special Assembly. In St Brigid's we know what to do when we are worried or sad. Each classroom has a Worry Box or "Worry Jar". We can talk to our Classroom Assistants our teacher, Mrs Donaghy or the Principal Mrs O'Kane.

Shared Education:

As part of the Shared Education Programme Primary 4 pupils from St Brigid's travelled to Lavey Termoneeny Centre to meet up with P4 pupils from Knockloughrim Primary School on 3rd, 10th and 17th October. Here they took part in their project – Physical Fitness, Mental Wellbeing and PDMU.













Ten Foundations Charity:

On Thursday 5th October Ian Campbell (founder of the charity) spoke to all the pupils at a special assembly to explain what the charity did. The Ten Foundations Charity support vulnerable children, families, and communities in the Philippines. At the school assembly we were delighted to present Ian with a donation on behalf of St Brigid's Mayogall, which will help towards buying a sewing machine. This will allow the charity to continue to help women get out of impoverished situations by providing them with the necessary skills and resources to learn how to use an industrial sewing machine.

Ian kindly left behind some bags which can be purchased directly from the school.
























Parent Teacher Meetings:

CREDIT UNION PRIZE WINNERS






St. Brigid's celebrated Maths week Ireland from 14th- 22nd October.
