This year Anti-Bullying Week took place from Monday 13th – Friday 17th November with the theme 'Make A Noise About Bullying'.


Each class had special lessons and activities exploring what bullying behaviour looks like. The younger pupils focused on how they could show kindness and the importance of feeling happy and safe in school. The older children discussed how to tell the difference between 'banter' and bullying and how we (as a school community) can make changes to reduce bullying.

Odd Socks Day 2023 took place on Monday 13th November. Everyone in school, including our principal Mrs O'Kane wore odd socks. This is always a fun day that allows the pupils to express themselves and celebrate their individuality. In addition, we held an Odd Socks colouring competition. There was a prize for the winning design from each class.

Primary 5 had fun coming to school in odd socks to mark the beginning of Anti-Bullying Week. They wore odd socks to show that they are all different and unique. They also participated in an online lesson about bullying, and designed some super odd socks! They particularly enjoyed working together to show our odd socks during their gymnastics lesson in PE. Roots of Empathy

This year, on Thursday 16th November Primary 5 took part in the Roots of Empathy Programme led by Miss McAlister. This is an award-winning programme which supports children's positive mental health and wellbeing. Primary 5 were introduced to Baby Ruby - their "Tiny Teacher," who they will get to know through nine monthly visits to the classroom. Over the course of the school year, they will watch the baby grow. The children will predict and celebrate when their Roots of Empathy baby reaches the 'developmental milestones' of the first year: The children will also observe and read the emotional cues of the baby and will use this knowledge when talking about their own emotions and to understand how their classmates feel. Roots of Empathy is founded on the loving relationship between a parent and baby, which is where empathy starts.

Roots of Empathy is a tried, tested and proven effective programme that increases children's kindness, caring, including, sharing and helping behaviours as they develop empathy. Research from 3 continents shows that as empathy develops, aggression and bullying behaviours are reduced.

Primary 5 pupils were excited to participate in Roots of Empathy and are looking forward to updating everyone on Baby Ruby's journey through her first year.

WORRY BUSTERS

On Thursday 16th November Primary 6 started the 'Worry Busters' programme, designed by RISE NI Clinical Psychology to educate young children about anxiety and to offer strategies to help cope with worry and to build resilience. Five workshops were offered to children, based on the following themes;

- Emotions
- Anxiety and Our Bodies
- Anxiety and Our Thoughts
- Thinking Traps
- Goal Setting and trying out coping strategies.

The aim of this programme was to develop an awareness of emotions and the effect of anxiety on our bodies, and to provide children with the breathing strategies, relaxation skills and cognitive approaches to challenge any worries or anxious thoughts they may have.

NO ONE CAN ENTER THE SCHOOL BUILDING ONCE THE DOOR IS SECURED AT 9:15AM

If P1 or P2 children arrive at school after 9:15am and the gate is locked, you go to reception, sign the late book and either the Principal or Secretary will take your child to class. You cannot escort your child to class. **SORRY!**

Pupils in other classes P3 — P7 who arrive after 9:15am must be signed in at Reception by the accompanying adult — no exceptions. Pupils should not go directly to Mobile Classrooms and press the Buzzer — they must be signed in.
